

THE STATE BIRD OF WASHINGTON IS THE AMERICAN GOLDFINCH. DO YOU KNOW THE STATE FLOWER AND THE STATE TREE?

ANSWER: THE COAST RHODODENDRON IS THE STATE FLOWER, AND OUR STATE TREE IS THE WESTERN HEMLOCK.

DID YOU KNOW THAT PINE CONES ARE ONLY FROM PINE TREES? DOUGLAS-FIR, WESTERN HEMLOCK, WESTERN REDCEDAR, AND RED ALDER CONES ARE ALSO FULL OF SEEDS THAT ANIMALS LOVE.



WETLANDS HELP CLEAN WATER BEFORE ENTERING OUR STREAMS AND RIVERS. CATTAILS, A WETLAND PLANT, ARE COMMON IN PARTS OF THE BELLEVUE PARK SYSTEM. CAN YOU FIND ANY?



HINT: CATTAILS CAN OFTEN BE FOUND AT THE EDGE OF LAKES AND PONDS.
